Graduation Requirements: 230 Credits

English - 8 semesters

Math – 4 semesters to include: Algebra 1 and Geometry, or Math 1 and Math 2

Social Science – 7 semesters (World Geography, World History, U.S. History, American Government and Economics)

Science – 4 semesters, including biological and physical sciences

Health – 1 semester

Physical Education – 8 semesters

Academic Breadth – 4 semesters to include:

One year of foreign language or visual/performing arts or career and technical training AND an additional year of foreign language, visual/performing arts or career and technical education.

61% of tests taken scored a 3 or higher

For the graduating class of 2016, 46% were eligible to go immediately to four-year colleges and approximately 25% attended a four-year college or university; 56% showed interest in two-year state community colleges, military, vocational/technical schools, or employment options and approximately 45% attended a two-year state community college.

GPA/CLASS RANK:

GPA and class rank are based on all graded courses. 4.0 scale is used for all classes with the exception of Advanced Placement courses, where the scale (A=5, B=4, C=3, D=1, F=0) is used.
