

CCC Culinary Program prepares Corpsmembers for careers in commercial kitchens and restaurants through daily hands-on work, specific trainings and community college partnerships.

The CCC is ready to enroll young adults motivated to learn or expand culinary skills!

TRAINING:

- Corpsmembers learn food preparation, tool usage, knife skills, measurement and conversions, cooking methods, baking, food storage, menu planning, and more!
- No previous kitchen or culinary experience required

REQUIREMENTS:

- Corpsmembers typically work four days a week, splitting their ten-hour shifts to prepare meals
- Culinary crews prepare breakfast and dinner for residential Corpsmember

BENEFITS:

- Corpsmembers can earn their ServSafe Food Handler and Food Manager Certifications
- Corpsmembers can be hired by the hospitality and tourism industry, private restaurants, state agencies, and more

Corpsmembers learn the skills they need to set out in the culinary industry. CCC aspiring chefs have the opportunity to participate in multiple Culinary and Outdoor Boot Camps.

The culinary program's content has been developed in partnership with the local hospitality industry to prepare Corpsmembers for successful entry into culinary jobs.

The CCC Energy Corps surveys government and non-profit buildings to determine energy use, retrofits lighting and control panels to reduce energy costs, installs solar panels, and conducts other energy industry work.

Training provided through partnerships with Cerritos and Sierra Colleges.

TRAINING:

- · Year-round training offered at Energy Corps locations in Fresno, Norwalk, Sacramento and Vista
- · All training and handson experience meets American Society of Heating, Refrigerating and Air-Conditioning Engineers standards

REQUIREMENTS:

- · Corpsmembers work variable shifts, often at night, to install lighting at schools, government buildings, and non-profits
- Must be willing to respond to emergencies and be on assignment for lengthy periods

BENEFITS:

- Energy Corps work limits Greenhouse Gas Emissions by reducing energy use and saves taxpayer dollars
- · Corpsmembers can be hired by environmenal and energy service companies in the private sector, solar companies, government agencies, and more!

As part of Energy Corps required training, Corpsmembers receive professional standard certifications to perform electrical work, including: OSHA-10 with Fall Protection, Lockout/Tagout Training, Scaffod/Aerial Lift certifications, Intro to Energy Surveys Course, Intro to Wiring & Lighting Retrofit Course, and more!











CCC WILDLAND FIREFIGHTING PROGRAM

CCC wildland firefighters respond to local and statewide wildland fires, working on the front lines to stop and slow the spread of wildland fires.

The CCC partners with CAL FIRE, U.S. Forest Service, & Bureau of Land Management.

TRAINING:

- Offered year-round and seasonally depending on location
- Earn wildland firefighting certifications, including: ICS 100, IS 700, L 180, S 190 and Chainsaw S212 and more

REQUIREMENTS:

- Corpsmembers must meet strict physical fitness requirements and pass written tests
- Must be willing to respond to emergencies and be on assignment for lengthy periods

BENEFITS:

- Training, hands-on experience, and gear provided
- Fire crews help protect local communities and residents from devastating wildfires

Corpsmembers gain valuable experience working on Type I and Type II hand crews providing initial attack and mop up support on wildfires.

A year in the CCC wildland firefighting program can lead to jobs with CAL FIRE, U.S. Forest Service, Bureau of Land Management, local city and county fire agencies.





CCC FORESTRY CORPS

The CCC Forestry Corps prepares Corpsmembers for careers in protecting and enhancing California's forests, parks, and communities.

Corpsmembers reduce dead and overgrown vegetation to reduce wildfire risk, plant trees, and earn arborist and forestry certifications.

TRAINING:

- Corpsmembers receive hands-on training in fuel reduction, forest resiliency, tree felling, planting and more!
- Earn certifications in Feller 3, chainsaw and arborist training, and more!

REQUIREMENTS:

- Corpsmembers often camp near worksites in remote forest areas to better access project locations, up to 8 days straight
- Must be willing to respond to emergencies and be on-assignment for lengthy periods of time

BENEFITS:

- Crews help protect
 California's forests and
 fire prone locations, while
 also improving visitor
 experiences in national,
 state and local parks
- Corpsmembers can be hired by private forestry companies, CAL FIRE, U.S. Forest Services, and more!

Corpsmembers learn about removing hazardous fire fuels, seedling and tree planting, forest resiliency, flora and fauna identification, and project specific terminology.

On-the-job training provides Corpsmembers with opportunities and experiences to assist them with obtaining forestry degrees, certificates, and careers.
