NCAA D1/D2 Eligibility Requirements

ACADEMIC REQUIREMENTS

To play sports at a Division I or II school, you must graduate from high school, complete 16 NCAA-approved core courses, earn a minimum GPA and earn an ACT or SAT score that matches your core-course GPA.

CORE COURSES

Visit **eligibilitycenter.org/courselist** for a full list of your high school's approved core courses. Complete 16 core courses in the following areas:

DIVISION I

Complete 10 NCAA core courses, including seven in English, math or natural/physical science, before your seventh semester.



*GPA:

Calculated based on the grades you earned in your NCAA-approved core courses.

*Send your test scores to NCAA (code: 9999).

DIVISION III INITIAL-ELIGIBILITY ACADEMIC REQUIREMENTS

- Each Division III college or university determines its own eligibility for:
 - Admission.
 - Financial aid.
 - Practice and competition.
- The NCAA Eligibility Center does not perform certifications for Division III college-bound student-athletes.
- Division III student-athletes may register for a free Profile Page and receive information, but it is not required.

Eligibility Center Registration

TWO ACCOUNT TYPES

Certification Account

- · Division I or Division II students.
- · Domestic fee \$90.
- International fee \$150.
- Account information, school and sports history.
- Required for signing a National Letter of Intent (NLI) with a Division I or Division II NCAA school.
- Required to go on an official visit to an NCAA Division I or Division II school.

Profile Page

- Undecided students.
- · Division III students.
- · No fee.
- Account information and school history.
- Can transition to a Certification Account at any time.
- Will not receive an academic or amateurism certification.

NAIA eligibility requirements

To be academically eligible, the eligibility center requires that incoming freshmen meet two of the following three criteria. Transfer students or those who took a break between high school and college will need to fulfill additional requirements, which we've outlined on our NAIA eligibility requirements page.

- Achieve a minimum of 16 on the ACT or 860 on the SAT*
- Achieve a minimum overall high school grade point average of 2.0 on a 4.0 scale
- Graduate in the top half of their high school class.

PlayNAIA.org helps future student-athletes discover and connect with NAIA schools, coaches and athletic scholarships. PlayNAIA is also the official clearinghouse for NAIA eligibility. Every student-athlete must register with the NAIA Eligibility Center to play sports at an NAIA college or university.
