Special Programs

Center for Advanced Research and Technology (CART): Provides a 75,000 square foot state-of-the-art research and technology facility where students design and complete projects in collaboration with partners from the local, national, and international business community. This year, CART enrolled 1,332 11th/12th grade students from 14 high schools throughout Clovis and Fresno Unified School Districts. Clovis High students account for 16% (218 students) of CART's total enrollment. Students apply and are selected through a lottery process (408 Clovis High students applied for the 2023-24 school year). Selected students attend half-day classes in one of the 12 laboratories taught by teams of instructors. Transportation is provided between Clovis High and CART.

Career Technical Education (CTE)/Regional Occupational Program (ROP): Prepares students for further education at colleges and universities, employment, or advanced technical training. Students also develop positive work attitudes and behaviors. Clovis High offers the following CTE courses: Child Development, Education, Residential & Commercial Construction, and Systems Diagnostics, Service, and Repair. Community College Classes & Dual Enrollment: In collaboration with State Center Community College District (SCCCD), Clovis High offers several opportunities for students to earn college credit. See <u>Clovis High website</u> for more information.

Advancement Via Individual Determination (AVID): Targets students in the academic middle (B, C, and even D students) who have the desire to go to college and the willingness to work hard. These students are capable of completing rigorous curriculum, but may be falling short of their potential. Often times, they will be the first in their families to attend college, and many are from socio-economically disadvantaged families.

Plans After Graduation (Graduating Class of 2023): 58.2% were eligible to go immediately to a four-year college. Of those eligible, 33.5% enrolled in a four-year college. 52.5% enrolled at a two-year community college, and 14% have other plans that include military, career technical schools, and employment.

GPA & Class Rank: GPA and class rank are based on all graded courses. A 4.0 scale is used for all classes with the exception of CSU/UC Approved Honors classes and AP courses, where the scale is as follows: A=5, B=4, C=3, D=1, F=0.
