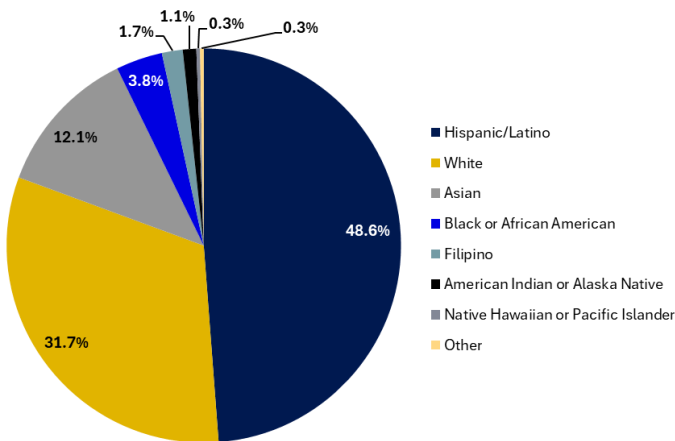
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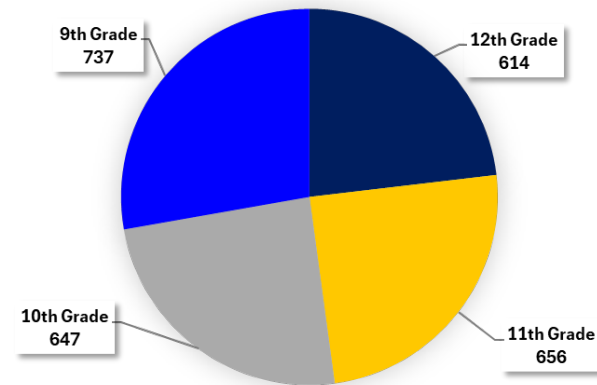

Clovis High School is a large public high school comprised of 2,764 students in grades 9-12 accredited by Western Association of Schools and Colleges. The city of Clovis is located in the central San Joaquin Valley, adjacent to Fresno. Clovis is a well-established suburban community with a population of 122,989.

## GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS: 230 CREDITS

**GPA & Class Rank:** GPA and class rank are based on all graded courses. A 4.0 scale is used for all classes with the exception of CSU/UC Approved Honors classes and AP courses, where the scale is as follows: A=5, B=4, C=3, D=1, F=0.

A certificated staff of 110 teachers, eight school counselors, three school psychologists. A support staff of 87 employees. Together we provide students with an environment that is both academically challenging and culturally enriching.

Clovis High School offers a robust academic program, including numerous honors and AP courses. However, due to master scheduling constraints, students may encounter conflicts that limit their ability to enroll in the maximum number of advanced courses. Additionally, unlike many other school districts, Clovis Unified requires a four-year Physical Education program, which further impacts scheduling flexibility.

The academic program utilizes a traditional 55-minute schedule on Monday, Tuesday & Friday. On Wednesdays & Thursdays, the school day starts later to provide time for staff professional development and classes are held in a block schedule (114-minutes). Each course is worth 5 credits per semester.

## SPECIAL PROGRAMS

**Center for Advanced Research and Technology (CART)**: Provides a 75,000 square foot state-of-the-art research and technology facility where students design and complete projects in collaboration with partners from the local, national, and international business community. This year, CART enrolled 1,259 11th/12th grade students from 14 high schools throughout Clovis and Fresno Unified School Districts. Clovis High students account for 15% (195 students) of CART's total enrollment. Students apply and are selected through a lottery process (354 Clovis High students applied for the 2024-2025 school year). Selected students attend half-day classes in one of the 12 laboratories taught by teams of instructors.

**Career Technical Education (CTE)/Regional Occupational Program (ROP)**: Prepares students for further education at colleges and universities, employment, or advanced technical training. Students also develop positive work attitudes and behaviors. Clovis High offers the following CTE courses: Child Development, Education, Residential & Commercial Construction, and Systems Diagnostics, Service, and Repair.
